Shelby Willis' artwork is inspired by her love for nature and her background in Ecology, the study of plants and animals. Creating has been a staple in her life ever since she was young. She is grateful for growing up in a family where creativity was always encouraged. She was very shy when she was young, and reflecting on it now, it's clear that she was able to find her voice through art.

She has always been drawn to animals, and through a combination of color, mark making, and intuitive brush strokes, she aims to capture and showcase their spiritual qualities. It is her hope that her artwork will both inspire environmental awareness and create a unique connection with its viewers.

Every painting is a journey led by layers of colors and patterns that evolve into a cohesive piece. Although she usually has a general idea of the subject matter that she wants to paint, she finds pure creative happiness and freedom in the process of trusting her intuition with each added layer and with no set expectations for how it will come to fruition. The joy that she finds in her painting process has inspired her to host and teach her own art retreats entitled Fearless Creativity for the Soul.

Shelby Willis has come a long

way since her shy days and now finds great joy in connecting with others through her art and teaching art classes. One of her favorite things about being an artist is hearing stories from viewers and collectors about how her work sparks meaningful memories or emotions for them.

Within moody landscapes, her one can find an abundance of wildflowers and native plants, breathing life into her canvases. Shorebirds and sea creatures, inspired by her explorations through hiking, kayaking, and ferrying along the mesmerizing west coast environment, now grace her creations.

Jean Bradbury's artistic prowess transcends borders, with her work adorning both private and public collections across the globe. From the USA and Canada to Australia, Jordan, the United Kingdom, and Greece, her art has found a special place in the hearts and spaces of admirers worldwide.

A true northwest artist, Jean finds her muse in the great outdoors, often venturing into nature through hikes or tranquil walks along the shoreline, where she draws inspiration from the plants and creatures that call these regions home.

Within Bradbury's art, a unique touch emerges as she plays with scale. She masterfully magnifies the often overlooked, small details of life, paying homage to their significance in the grand tapestry of existence.


